Top edge for 1.5 inches Left edge for 1.5 inches bottom edge for 1 inch Right edge for 1 inch Font size for 16 pt Font: Angsana UPC

### 1.3 Layout of the cover print

Top edge 1.5 inches Left edge 1.5 inches bottom edge 1 inch Right edge 1 inch Font size 20 pt Font: Angsana UPC

The color of the cover is crimson and the text is gold and bold faced.

Rangsit University Logo in gold color (Width of 0.6 inch and length of 1

inch)

Spine of the cover consists of research title, head of the research project (without specifying a prefix) and the year of the research grant (using Arabic numerals).


### 2. Writing Research Article

### 2.1 Components of a research article


- 1) Research Title and Researcher Name (Thai English)
- 2) Abstract not more than 15 lines
- 3) Key words should not exceed 5 words.
- 4) An Introduction consists of background of the study, significance, and purpose of research
  - 5) Definition of terms

- 6) Methods of research include population and sample, sampling technique, scope of the study, plan and schedule, research instruments, procedures of constructing research instruments, data collection, data analysis, and statistics used.
- 7) Research Results / Results: If Tables are provided, then write the name of each Table at the top. If Figures, then write the name of each Figure at the bottom.
  - 8) Discussion
  - 9) Research recommendations
  - 10) Acknowledgments
  - 11) Bibliography

Note: Reference and bibliography must follow the citation format of the APA (American Psychological Association).



# Abstract Sample



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The purposes of this research were: to study the students' information of reading and opinions on faculty reading promotion of the undergraduate students in Rangsit University. The sample was 370 students from 10 faculties during the first semester of academic year of 2006. The data were analyzed by percentage, mean and standard deviation. The students' comments were presented by frequency distribution.

The results of this research are as follows: The duration of time the student read were 4.12 days per week and 30 minutes each time. They preferred reading from books and reading about movie stars. Their purpose on reading was to entertain themselves and they enjoyed reading at their own rooms. Most of the students preferred buying books for reading. The students from Faculty of Liberal Arts indicated that they had reading problems. Most of the student's thought reading was necessary for their everyday life and people of all ages should read. The students of all faculty agreed that reading was the most important skill. The students from 7 faculties informed that they were assigned to read text books whereas the students from 4 faculties were assigned to read external books. The result on the students' comment can be concluded that teaching and learning activities; library management and University support should be developed to encourage student's reading.

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

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### 1. Introduction

The article should be at least 6 pages long and not more than 8 pages (including Figures and Tables). Use 14-point Angsana New printed in the size specified in the article. Figures must be in black and white so that they are clear and the number of each Figure with descriptive title must be under each one. The size of Figures should be appropriate, not too small or too large and the letters in Figures must be clear and readable.



For references to documents used in the article, use brackets such as [1] or [2-4], etc. The author should refer and cite fully and accurately to honor the reference source. The article should contain main content / results, summary / conclusion and discussion, acknowledgments (if any) and references.
